The Roles & Experiences of Native American Directors of Native Student Support Services

Native Students in Higher Ed

Colonial Era, 1600s – 1700s

- Institutions were founded with missions to "civilize" and Christianize Native Americans
- 47 Native students enrolled, only 4 graduated

Federal Era, 1700s – 1900s

- U.S. Govt signed 97 treaties establishing a trustee responsibility for educating Native people
- Five Civilized Tribes established their own highly successful school systems, until...
- o U.S. Govt enforced federal boarding schools for Native children

• Self-Determination Era, 1900s – Present

- Meriam Report (1928) exposed lack of higher ed opportunities for Native college students
- o Indian Relocation Act (1936) attempt to assimilate young Native people in cities
- o 34 TCUs established on/near tribal lands
- Native students make up 0.9% of American college/university students

Native American College Student Experience

- Institutional racism
- Colorblind ideologies
- Lack of cultural awareness
- Lack of cultural sensitivity
- Lack of N.A. staff & faculty
- Lack of culturally relevant course material or social activities
- Low expectations

- Stereotyping
- Misunderstandings
- Devaluing of cultural differences
- Lack of resources
- Lack of voice
- Exclusion from institutional data
- Heavy recruitment & low support

Native Student Support Services (NSSS)

- Participation in NSSS contributes to N.A. student retention by:
 - Helping students navigate the transition from high school
 - Helping students contend with campus hostility
 - Supporting academic and social engagement
- N.A. people make up approximately 1% of faculty/staff in higher ed
 - There are no published empirical studies on the experiences of N.A. staff or student affairs educators

Research Purpose & Questions

- The purpose of this narrative study is to explore the roles and experiences of N.A. Directors of NSSS in supporting N.A. students at PWIs using TribalCrit.
 - 1. What is the experience of N.A. Directors of NSSS in PWIs?
 - 2. What approaches do N.A. Directors of NSSS take in their work in PWIs?
 - 3. How do PWIs help or hinder the work of N.A. Directors of NSSS?

Methodology

- Transformative paradigm
- Indigenous Knowledge Systems epistemology
- TribalCrit theoretical perspective
- Narrative Inquiry design
 - Interviews with 6 N.A. Directors of NSSS at PWIs
 - All different tribes and tribal regions

Building Trust Before the Interview

- Endorsed as an "insider" by a third party
- Provided interview questions ahead of time
- Introduced myself and my purpose/intentions
- Discussed reciprocity
- Discussed member-checking

Findings

- 1. N.A. NSSS Directors' experience in PWIs mirrors the experiences of N.A. students in PWIs, past and present
- 2. Differences in N.A. cultural approaches to working in a PWI
- 3. PWI's do not fully understand the need for NSSS
- 4. Institutional tracking of N.A. students is not congruent with how N.A. people identify themselves
- 5. Non-N.A. educators need to learn about the needs and experiences of N.A. students, then support NSSS efforts
